

Safeguarding Issue

Being vigilant to the risk of Radicalisation and Extremism

It can happen anywhere!

Who is at risk?

All young people could potentially be at risk – there is no such thing as a typical extremist!

Factors that increase vulnerability

- Being isolated feeling different
- Having Additional Learning Needs
- Family circumstances

 e.g. loss, bereavement,
 divorce
- Cultural / religious influences and differences

This is not exhaustive!

There could be other factors that make a young person more vulnerable.

What should we look for?

Critical risk factors could include:

- Being in contact with extremist recruiters;
- Accessing violent extremist websites, especially those with a social networking element;
- Possessing or accessing violent extremist literature;
- Using extremist narratives and a global ideology to explain personal disadvantage;
- Justifying the use of violence to solve societal issues;
- Joining or seeking to join extremist organisations:
- Significant changes to appearance and/or behaviour:
- Experiencing a high level of social isolation resulting in issues of identity crisis and/or personal crisis.

What should you do? This is a Safeguarding issue.
